## Children's Camp 2022

Before this month, the last camp by Mission UpReach held for the children of western Honduras was in January of 2020. The pandemic put a hold on many of our normal activities, as it did everywhere. We are truly thankful that this year the mission was able to offer several weeks of camp for a variety of age groups. For the first week, we drove nineteen children from Potrerillos and Corquín to Santa Rosa so they could meet up with the bus heading to camp. This was the week for the youngest aged children. The second week we had nine go. This is an amazing opportunity for the children to experience something new and to learn about Jesus. Several months ago, we wrote about Sofia, an eleven-year-old girl who attends all our church activities and considers herself "one of the ladies." Sofia began coming to services after attending camp one year several years ago. She is the only one of her family that attends regularly, but sometimes her brother joins her. She has also participated in our tutoring classes last year. Please pray that others that have attended camp will also be drawn to Jesus and we can have the opportunity to reach their families.

On January 30, we invited the families of the children who attended camp this month to join us for services in Corquín. We celebrated the children that went to camp, shared a video made up of photos taken during the camp sessions, and finished the afternoon with cake and coffee. There were about seventy-five in attendance on Sunday and we are making plans to visit with all who came with their children but have never come before. Please keep these precious souls in your prayers as God uses our feeble efforts to reach the lost.

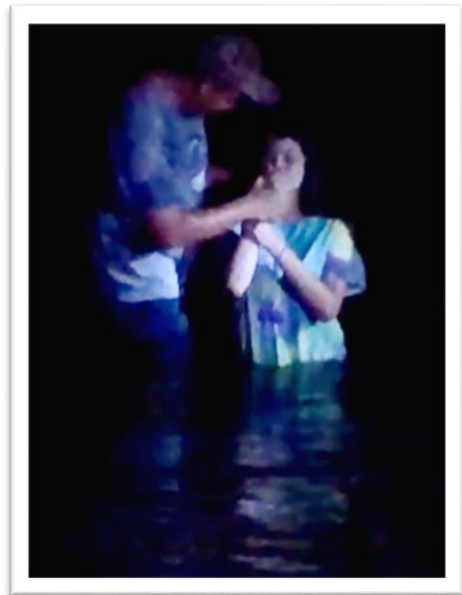
